DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Cabaret

Willkommen, bienvenue, welcome. Leave your troubles outside. Here, life is *beautiful*.

Welcome to our production of *Cabaret*, a musical that has earned its place in the pantheon of beloved stage classics. Few musicals share the popularity of *Cabaret*, and it's not hard to see why. This show is a masterclass in entertainment and seduction, a profound mix of political and social issues that are as relevant today as they were when the musical first premiered.



Cabaret is not a musical about Nazi Berlin. Instead, it takes us into the uncertain and chaotic world of the Weimar Republic, a period of post-World War I Germany that was filled with wild art and a vibrant nightclub scene, but also marred by the threat of the unknown. The story, penned by Joe Masteroff, begins in 1929, a time when the morality in Berlin was decaying as rapidly as the democratic system.

Our journey begins with the Emcee, our guide through this world, welcoming us with open arms. But as the show progresses, we witness the decline of this carefree way of life, mirroring the end of the Weimar Republic and the rise of Nazism. The Kit Kat Klub, once a symbol of freedom and decadence, becomes a reflection of the societal changes happening outside its doors.

In *Cabaret*, we are reminded of the power of theatre to entertain, to seduce, but also to provoke thought and conversation. This musical, with its blend of political and social issues, invites us to reflect on our own world, our own uncertainties, and our own societal changes.

TREVOR SMITH DIGGINS Adjudicator, Play Polisher • Theatre Ontario

An accomplished actor, director, producer, and alumnus of the former *Theatre Ontario Talent Bank*, Trevor returns to WODL as our travelling adjudicator, following his previous tour in 2019.

A familiar face on the WODL festival circuit, Trevor received his first adjudicators' award for acting in 1980. Since then, he has earned numerous honors for his work in the region, including three best actor awards. He also advanced to win the top award twice again at Theatre Ontario festivals.

In the Greater Toronto region, Trevor adjudicated for the *Association of Community Theatres Central Ontario (ACT-CO)* in 2016 and 2017. And he served three times on adjudication panels for Sears Drama Festivals.



Directing credits include *Company*, *Venus in Fur*, *Marjorie Prime*, *Noises Off*, *Calendar Girls*, *Shirley Valentine*, *Misery*, *The House of Blue Leaves*, *Come Back to the 5&Dime*, *God of Carnage*, and *Stepping Out*.

As an actor, Trevor has played several challenging roles onstage, including Martin in *The Goat*, Norman in *The Dresser*, John Merrick in *The Elephant Man*, Roy in *Cosi*, Robin in *The Wild Guys*, Underling in *The Drowsy Chaperone*, Allan in *Harvest*, Hal in *Self-Help*, Lionel in *Bakersfield Mist*, and multiple roles in the Toronto premiere of *The Normal Heart*.

Trevor's resumé also includes a few film and TV gigs, plus two turns on the ballroom floor, winning silver (2010) and gold medals (2011) in *Dancing with the Stars*, a fundraiser for *Hope Spring Cancer Support Centre*. In 2023, he used his voice in support of the *Downie-Wenjack Fund* as a featured soloist for three benefit performances of *In View: The Lyrics of Gord Downie in Concert*.

Trevor is passionate about helping other theatre artists to make compelling choices that resonate on the stage. He's frequently called upon by community theatre groups to conduct play-polishing workshops for actors and directors during their rehearsal process.

Trevor is a founding director of The Downtown Theatre Project, an independent, profit-sharing company launched in 2018 to produce mainstage shows for small performance spaces in Guelph.

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
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SYNOPSIS

In a Berlin nightclub, as the 1920s draw to a close, a garish Master of Ceremonies welcomes the audience and assures them they will forget all their troubles at the Cabaret. With the Emcee's bawdy songs as wry commentary, Cabaret explores the dark, heady and tumultuous life of Berlin's natives and expatriates as Germany slowly yields to the emerging Third Reich. Cliff, a young American writer newly arrived in Berlin, is immediately taken with English singer Sally Bowles. Meanwhile, Fräulein Schneider, proprietor of Cliff and Sally's boarding house, tentatively begins a romance with Herr Schultz, a mild-mannered fruit seller who happens to be Jewish.
